Currently studying medicine full-time in Thailand, Narisa could trace her involvement and interest in the fields of public health and human rights back to her high school days in New Zealand. In 2016, she was a scholarship recipient for New Zealand Model United Nations and Aoteroa Youth Declaration, becoming a part of the national youth presence. She was then selected to attend the Rotary National Science Youth Forum the year after, which, along with leading her school's Amnesty International society and 40-Hour Famine Committee, began her introduction to the inextricability of health and science to all aspects of life and society. She graduated as one of New Zealand's International Baccalaureate Top Scholars in 2017, and thereafter became a medical student at Chulalongkorn University.
